Crocus Rose - New For 2019!

Rosa 'Crocus'

Height: 4 feet

Spread: 3 feet

Description:

A very desirable rose with elegant soft apricot blooms paling to cream; pleasing tea fragrance; needs full sun and well-drained soil; good disease resistance; a robust and free flowering rose

Ornamental Features

Crocus Rose features showy fragrant peach flowers with creamy white overtones at the ends of the branches from late spring to early fall. The flowers are excellent for cutting. It has forest green foliage throughout the season. The glossy oval compound leaves do not develop any appreciable fall color. The fruit is not ornamentally significant.

Landscape Attributes

Crocus Rose is a multi-stemmed deciduous shrub with an upright spreading habit of growth. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

This is a high maintenance shrub that will require regular care and upkeep, and is best pruned in late winter once the threat of extreme cold has passed. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Disease
- Spiny

Crocus Rose is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Mass Planting
- Hedges/Screening
- General Garden Use

Planting & Growing

Crocus Rose will grow to be about 4 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It tends to fill out right to the ground and therefore doesn't necessarily require filler plants in front. It grows at a fast rate and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 20 years.
