### Andeley Whitecedar

*Chamaecyparis thyoides 'Andeleyensis'*

Height: 4 feet

Spread: 3 feet

Other Names: Whitecedar Falsecypress, Atlantic White Cedar

#### Description:

We also sell a variety similar to, but more dwarf than, Andelyensis called Little Jamie. Lovely gray green color during the growing season and plum color in winter.

#### Ornamental Features

Andeley Whitecedar has light green foliage. The scale-like leaves turn coppery-bronze in fall. Neither the flowers nor the fruit are ornamentally significant. The furrowed gray bark adds an interesting dimension to the landscape.

#### Landscape Attributes

Andeley Whitecedar is a multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with a distinctive and refined pyramidal form. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other landscape plants with less refined foliage.

This is a high maintenance shrub that will require regular care and upkeep. When pruning is necessary, it is recommended to only trim back the new growth of the current season, other than to remove any dieback. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Andeley Whitecedar is recommended for the following landscape applications;

### **Planting & Growing**

Andeley Whitecedar will grow to be about 4 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It has a low canopy. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 60 years or more.

This shrub should only be grown in full sunlight. It is quite adaptable, preferring to grow in average to wet conditions, and will even tolerate some standing water. It is particular about its soil conditions, with a strong preference for sandy, acidic soils. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. Consider applying a thick mulch around the root zone in winter to protect it in exposed locations or colder microclimates. This is a selection of a native North American species.
